Fifth Annual Birdfest is a Big Success

Like the annual migration of birds, the 5th annual John L. Borom Alabama Coastal BirdFest has come and gone for another year. If you took part, you know that we enjoyed four days of wonderful weather, great birding, and good fun. Once again, registrants came from all over the United States to enjoy guided birding tours by land and on boats, evening dinner events, and the day long Bird & Conservation Expo.

"We were afraid that the price of gas and other travel woes might keep registration down this year, but it didn't seem to affect it," said BirdFest coordinator Fran Morley. "We had participants from all over our immediate

area, as well as from Georgia, Tennessee, Kentucky, New York, California, Virginia, Indiana, Michigan, Texas, Ohio, and Ontario, Canada. One fellow from Canada was back for his second BirdFest, so we must be doing something right."

This year for the first time, BirdFest partnered with the Fairhope Public Library on a number of events as a lead in to BirdFest, including a month-long showing of photos by Terry Hartley, special bird and nature films, and an art contest for 3rd grade students in Fairhope schools. "The Friends of the Library and the library staff were invaluable, and the contest was so much fun," Morley said. "We

had a hard time picking three winners from among all the entries." The winning artists received a book about birds of America, a ribbon and certificate, and bird feeders for themselves and their classrooms.

"It's great to get young people involved with BirdFest," said John Borom. "Perhaps one day, these kids will be leading birding tours for BirdFest."
